## Transportation Etiquette & Issues

### Q: Who's supposed to ride with whom if we hire limousines?

A: It's really up to you. You can go all out and arrange for a limo to get the guys (groomsmen and groom) to the ceremony site, one for the bridesmaids to get from the bride's home (or hotel suite) to the wedding, and one for the bride and her escort. Or, if it's possible for the wedding party to get to and from the wedding locations in their own cars (or by carpooling together or with guests), you might hire just one limousine for the bride and her escort to ride to the ceremony site and then to take the newlyweds to the reception. Sometimes the best man and maid of honor share the ride to the reception with the bride and groom.
